Kaboom about much more than fireworks

Concerts, more to rock July 3 event

Editor's note: This is the third in a four-part series leading up to a special preview of the Red, White and Kaboom celebration in Fairfield.

To accompany an evening filled with fireworks, music seems to be the perfect fit. And even though the sounds coming from Harbin Park around 10 p.m. July 3 are expected to be booming, it's the sounds that will come from before the big bang at the annual Red, White and Kaboom celebration that are expected to be a popular attraction. Bands will hit the stages starting around 6:30 p.m.

The programs will begin earlier than last year, said Fairfield Recreation Programmer Ben Strickler.

"We have a little more time this year, and we can get the community more involved," Strickler said.

Because the event will be held on a Thursday, the last day of work for many before the three-day weekend, the timing allows everyone to take full advantage of the performances throughout the evening.

First up is the Ohio Military Band at the Village Green amphitheater from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. More than 100 years old, this group focuses on patriotic sounds, perfect for Independence Day festivities.

About midway through the Ohio Military Band show, the Lori Lee Band will plug in

around 7 p.m. at Harbin Park. Lee is known for her patriotic memorial in Fairfield after the Sept. 11, 2001, tragedy.

"Considering her performance in the past, we thought she would fit in with that atmosphere at Harbin Park and give a great show," Strickler said.

Sprinkled in between as a filler, members from the Cincinnati Gymnastics Academy will perform at Village Green around 7:30 p.m. Not only will they flip and tumble while musicians are setting up and tearing down, but the team is expected to incorporate a routine with a few of the performers.

Prepare to get rocked around 8 p.m. when Dangerous Jim and the Slims take the stage at Village Green. An eight-piece band with horn section, the Slims are expected to jam until 10 p.m., so

be ready for some surprises like the addition of the Fairfield High School Choir on tunes by Queen and David Bowie.

"We wanted to involve the community more, and I wanted to try something different," said Dangerous Jim frontman, Jim Miller Jr.

It's a big event, not only for the city, but the musicians as well, so Miller has every reason to be excited.

"It's going to be the best rock concert that venue has ever seen," he said.

All performances will end before the 10 p.m. fireworks show, but not before members of the Wind Riders Sky Diving Troop make a landing at both locations. Expect them around 9:30 p.m., weather permitting, Strickler said.

Despite the events planned by

the city, those living close to Village Green and Harbin Park expected to throw parties of their own.

"This year's fireworks show facilitated by the world famous Rossi family, is expected to last 30 minutes."

three-piece horn section.

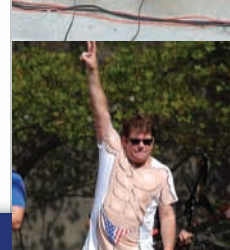

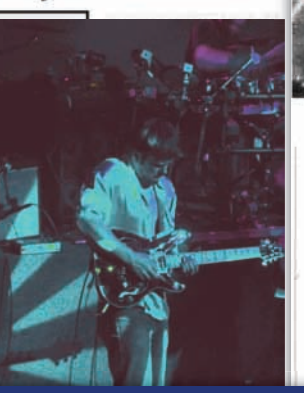
